## 4-H DAIRY QUIZ BOWL AND MANAGEMENT CONTEST

In 2016 the Wisconsin **4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl** and Management contests will move to the UW-Madison campus and will be held on Saturday January 30, 2016. Entries for the Wisconsin 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl and Management contests are DUE on January 15, 2016. The event will start at 9:45am in the Sewell Social Science Building, which is the building next to the bell tower, and will cost \$10 per team.

In the dairy bowl, contestants will answer a variety of questions about dairy cattle. All questions will come from the sources listed in the official dairy bowl rules which can be found on the Wisconsin Dairy Youth website at

http://fyi.uwex.edu/dairyyouth/. Teams compete in a double elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by the moderator. There will be three divisions; Junior, Senior and Mixed, which may be composed of both Junior and Senior aged participants. Junior participants must be 4-H members up to age 13 on January 1, 2016 and Senior participants must be aged 14-18 on January 1, 2016.

The winning Senior dairy bowl team will represent Wisconsin at the Invitational 4-H youth Dairy Bowl Contest at the North American International Livestock Exposition (N.A.I.L.E) in Louisville, KY.

The **Dairy Management Contest** will be held on the same day as the Quiz Bowl Contest and is open to both Junior and Senior aged participants. The 2016 Junior Dairy Management contest will focus on dairy cattle reproduction while the Senior contest could have questions related to the entire dairy industry.

The winning Senior management team will represent Wisconsin at the All-American Junior Dairy Management Contest in Harrisburg, PA.

## 2016 COMMUNICATIONS TEAM DIRECTOR JOB DESCRIPTION

The Wisconsin 4-H Communications Team is a new group of teens and their advisors whose

mission is to communicate the story and value of 4-H Youth Development in Wisconsin to two audiences: 4-H Youth, Parents and volunteers and potential 4-H members/parents and volunteers. The team director will provide training and expertise in one of three focus areas: photography, videography or writing. The Communications Team director will guide youth team members and encourage their leadership in all aspects of the team's work including: development of a mixed-media presentation for delegates attending the 2016 Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference; creation of a promotional video for 4-H and the Youth conference; and selecting 4-H events and experiences for stories to be written and published on the 4-H blog. The Communications Team Director will select fourteen to sixteen teens to be part of the 2016 Communications Team.

#### Requirements

- Must be an enrolled 4-H volunteer in good standing at the time of application (this includes a completed background check and 4-H Youth Protection Training).
- 2. Must be mature and responsible.
- Experience in **one** of the following: digital photography, videography and writing is preferred.
- Past attendance at the Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference is preferred, but not required.
- 5. Must be able to participate in the all State Group Planning weekend, from 6:00 pm, Friday, April 8, through 4:00 pm Saturday, April 9.
- Must be able to participate in the 2016 Wisconsin 4-H & Youth conference full time from Noon, Wednesday June, 15 through Noon, Thursday, June 23.

- 7. Must be able to participate at the Wisconsin State Fair, August 2016 (specific dates TBA later)
- 8. Must e-mail a cover letter describing your work in one of the three focus areas of: photography, videography or writing, including a description of your experience working in a creative, 4-H setting with youth to: wi4h.artteams@gmail.com
- 9. Must e-mail samples of your work in one of the three focus areas: photography (three photos), videography (2, 2-3 minute edited videos) or writing (2, writing samples 2-3 pages each).
- 10. Must email two letters of recommendation. which include your experience working with youth, to: wi4h.artteams@gmail.com
- 11. Application materials must be received by midnight, January 28, 2016

- 1. Select Communications Team members from applicant pool
- 2. Participate and co-coordinate the weekend orientation and training at Camp Upham Woods, April 8-9, 2016.

- 3. Co-present the Communications Team faceto-face orientation at 1:00 pm, Wednesday June 15th.
- 4. Coordinate scheduled Communications Team trainings during conference.
- 5. Provide direction and support, using a youth development approach, to team members as they develop a multi-media conference presentation for participants during conference assembly.
- 6. Coordinate the following: photos of seminar participants in action and state teams during pre-conference and performance.
- 7. Coordinate the writing of articles about 4-H events and experiences for the Wisconsin 4-H blog.
- 8. Post approved photos and videos on social media sites.
- 9. Develop a web site gallery on Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference.
- 10. Participate in and facilitate program evaluations with the Communications Team at end of conference.
- II. Coordinate photo, video and story coverage of select 4-H and UW-Extension events at Wisconsin State Fair.

#### RULES AND GUIDELINES

- Each 4-H member may perform in two events in divisions A-E either as an individual, small group or large group/club
  performance. Example: Small group vocal (Division D) and small group instrumental (Division A) and your club's
  performance OR Individual piano and small group vocal and your club's performance. An entrant cannot perform a
  small group vocal with two 4-Hers and a small group vocal with two different 4-Hers as he/she would be competing
  against himself/herself. All clubs are encouraged to bring a large ensemble, as it builds club cohesiveness.
- Solos and small ensembles are limited to three minutes. Advanced piano performers are allotted five minutes. Points
  will be deducted if contestant goes over the time limit.
- Each individual/small group entry should consist of one musical selection.
- Each instrumental and piano performer must provide the judge a copy of the music they are performing.
- Voice over tapes or CDs are allowed but strongly discouraged. Please try to use an accompanist or background
  music tape or CD. If the singer must use a voice over recording, the singer will need to use a microphone to have
  his/her voice heard over that of the recorded performer.
- In all divisions, appearance and stage presence will count as part of your score. Remember to dress so that you look your best!
- See back for judging criteria.
- Monetary awards will be given to 1st-4th place.




