Youth need opportunities to express themselves in a variety of ways. This is an encouraging reminder to get those registration forms in by the deadline, January 16th at 4:30 p.m.

Participating in activities that involve music, drama, creative writing, public speaking and visual arts aren't just ways for youth to have fun. What's important about the arts is that they help youth develop knowledge and skills they'll be able to use all through life.

These kinds of opportunities help youth develop confidence in their ability to express themselves in front of others. And that can make it easier for them to form strong relationships and assume leadership roles.

Why is the 4-H Arts and Communication Program so popular?

- Youth can start 4-H arts and communication projects at a younger age than other 4-H projects, (EX; Animal Science projects).
- Youth can do things at a younger age than what is available in school.
- 4-H arts and communication projects help prepare youth for their futures (EX: public speaking). 4-H music contests and cultural arts fest provides opportunities to engage in creative activity within the 4-H club context.


