

Burnett County Window Display Contest Judging Guidelines



- Conveys a message: A viewer leaving the exhibit knows something about a 4-H club, UW-Extension, community services, etc., that they did not know before. The message should be clear.
- Attracts Attention: Attracts favorable attention to the display. Design: Elements of the exhibit are placed effectively to give the window a complete and finished look. The message should be a part of the design.
- Attracts Interest: The display encourages viewers to seek additional information.
 Display appeals to the intended audience.
- Workmanship: Neat and well constructed though not necessarily expensive.
- · Originality: Evidence of creative thought.
- Must positively promote 4-H and be creative.
- Must be visible 24/7 (if business in not open 24/7, the display must be in a window)
- Must contain contact information, including the UW-Extension phone number.
- Must have the club name visible.
- Must be up NO LATER than 12:00 p.m. the day prior to the beginning of National 4-H Week and remain up through the last day of the week (Saturday).

**The 4-H Emblem shall appear whole and not covered by other objects. The tail must point to the right. This is a federal law.

Online Fall Forum Registration Opens September 1, 2011

What is Fall Forum? The purpose of Fall Forum is the annual meeting of the Wisconsin State 4-H Adult Leader Council (ALC) and Wisconsin State 4-H Youth Leader Council (YLC). The Fall Forum is a living demonstration of youth adult partnerships at their highest level.

Who attends Fall Forum? Each county has one adult delegate that serves on ALC. In addition, ALC has provided the opportunity for one youth delegate from a county to attend Fall Forum. Other attendees include current ALC Board members, current YLC members and invited YLC candidates.

What happens at Fall Forum? Each of the 72 Wisconsin counties selects at least one adult and one youth 4-H volunteer to actively participate in Fall Forum. The adult volunteer delegates are considered the members of the Wisconsin 4-H Adult Leader Council with a one year term and this serving as their annual meeting. The Forum provides volunteers the opportunity to learn, teach, network, and discuss critical issues and initiatives with the 4-H Youth Development program area on policies and direction affecting Wisconsin 4-H. Volunteers practice and demonstrate youth adult partnerships at the highest level through this experience. The experience involves adult 4-H volunteers that are members of the Wisconsin State 4-H Adult Leader Council Board (ALC) and the Wisconsin State 4-H Youth Leader Council (YLC). These volunteer leaders are selected through a statewide process to provide leadership and support for all 4-H volunteers.

Fall Forum gives each county the opportunity to have a voice in the future of Wisconsin 4-H. Let your voice be heard through attending this year's Fall Forum. During business meetings, ALC will select the ALC Board member and YLC votes on new YLC members.

REGISTRATION: Registration for 2011Fall Forum will all be done on line through UW-Extension County offices. There will be one registration for all persons coming from a county including the 2011 ALC adult delegate and youth delegate, ALC Executive Board members, YLC members, and YLC applicants. Information will be included in the 2011 Information Letter. Registration will be open 9-1-2011 through 10-3-2011 only. There will be no late or onsite registration. Registration costs will be reduced to \$25.00 for all participants. Registration fees are due by county at time of registration

SAVE THE DATE!! You won't want to miss this great opportunity to attend a workshop designed to teach youth and adults alike a variety of wildlife ecology activities for enhancing shooting sports programs, club meetings, countywide events, camps and activities in the field. Some activities include plaster tracks, wildlife food identification, outdoor survival kits and GPS and compass activities. 4-H Youth (10 years old minimum) and adult 4-H leaders and non-leaders are encouraged to attend this full day Saturday workshop on September 24 at the beautiful Wisconsin Lions Camp in Rosholt, WI. This wildlife training (not a 4-H Shooting Sports Wildlife certification) is being held at the same time as the statewide 4-H Shooting Sports certification, so leaders and youth attending either the workshop or the certification are encouraged to travel together. There will be some hands-on activities for wildlife participants from 6-9 on Friday evening should participants arrive early, however, the Friday evening session is optional and is not part of the 8AM to 4:30 PM Saturday workshop. The workshop registration fee is the same whether you use the Friday overnight accommodations at the Lion's Camp or you register for just the Saturday session. The adult registration fee is \$15 and \$10 for youth. Both the Wildlife Workshop and the Shooting Sports certification programs run concurrently, so you will only be able to attend one or the other. 2011 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS CERTIFICATION TRAINING SCHEDULE

To serve as a **Shooting Sports leader**, 4-H leaders must complete the Youth Protection process, must be at least 18 years old, and must have participated in at least one state-level 4-H Leader Training SHOOTING SPORTS CERTIFICATION WORKSHOP in the discipline in which they are providing supervision. If an adult leader is not certified, he/she cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a certified leader being present. A leader may obtain certification in an additional discipline (archery, pistol, coordinator, muzzleloader, rifle [.177 pellet, .177 BB, and .22], and shotgun) by completing a certification workshop provided by 4-H certified state training team members. Certification Workshops are not designed to teach volunteers how to use archery equipment or shoot a firearm, but are designed to teach adults how to conduct safe, supervised, shooting experiences for 4-H members enrolled in the project. **Therefore only adults who have experience in safely handling archery equipment and/or firearms should enroll in these certification workshops**.

For 2011 there will be three certifications offered, one northern, one central and one southern location in the state and will again be spring and fall dates. For 2012 there will be three certifications offered one Eastern, one Central and one Western. These will be spring and falls dates to be determined.
