



Record Book Tips

Record books are due in September! While you have been working on your Record Books the entire 4-H year, here are a few tips to remember when you are putting in your final touches:

- Make sure your book is neat and tidy
- Complete your inside front and back covers (use the green 4-H Record Book cover).
- Make sure all of the required pages are included and in the correct order.
- Include pictures, newspaper articles and judge's sheets.
- Highlight your name in any included articles.
- Do not include ribbons, pins, whole programs or Bugles, or any 4-H project materials.

Wisconsin Sheep Breeders Cooperative's 2012 Annual Photo Contest.



The winner of the youth class in the Wisconsin Sheep Breeders Cooperative's 2012 annual photo contest will win a special prize--an Andis Model 6800 Heavy Duty Sheep Shears. The shears has a retail value of \$380 and is sponsored by Blain's Farm & Fleet. Woodman's Markets is sponsoring the contest's grand prize of \$50 in photo developing services. Other class winners will receive a \$50 cash prize from contest sponsors, including *The Country Today* and *Wisconsin State Farmer*.

The photo contest, which has five categories, is open to anyone regardless of whether they own sheep or are WSBC members. The youth category is open to anyone who is 18 years old and younger.

To enter, submit a color or black-and-white non-mounted print that is approximately 8 x 10 inches. You may enter more than one photo in any of the categories. A \$5 per photo entry fee must accompany each entry; make checks payable to WSBC. Premiums will be awarded based on the number of contest entries. Detailed entry requirements are available on the Wisconsin Sheep & Wool Festival's website, www.wisconsinsheepandwoolfestival.com.

In addition to the Photo Taken By Youth class, other contest categories include Scenic Photo, Just Lambs, Kids and Sheep, and Any Other Sheep or Wool Photo.

The initial screening of photos will be based on clarity, content, composition and appeal. The photos will be on display at the 2012 Wisconsin Sheep & Wool Festival-to be held September 7-9 at Jefferson Fair Park. Visitors to the Festival will vote on the finalist photos.

2013 Burnett County Plat Book



The Burnett County 4-H Leaders Association is making preparations for the next Plat Book and they need your help! We need a picture for the cover of the newest edition of the Plat Book.

The sale of Burnett County Plat Books is the main fundraiser for our 4-H organization. With funds from plat book sales, the Leaders Association sponsors project premiums, awards, in-state and out-of-state trips and other great opportunities for our 4-H members. A new plat book is created every three years.

The newest plat book is currently being designed. It is scheduled to be completed and available for sale this fall. The Leaders Association will be providing a photo or photos for the cover of the book. **Do you have a great photo that represents what Burnett County means to you?** All members of 4-H families can enter the contest: parents, youth, and leaders. The winner(s) will receive a plat book when it is finished and their picture in the paper with the winning photograph(s).

Rules:

- Photos must have been taken in Burnett County after August 1, 2012
- Submit an 8x10 (or larger) print of your photo, with your name and club written on the back.
- Digital photos are preferred, as this is how the plat book company will need them. High resolution photos are necessary. Winning photographers will be asked to supply the original .jpg or .tif file.
- Photos should be of nature, scenery, etc. Silhouettes of people are okay if they enhance a scene. There should be no identifiable faces.
- You may submit multiple entries.
- Entries do not need a title. They do not need to be mounted.

Photo submissions are due by August 1. Give them to your club's General Leader or drop them off/mail to the UW-Extension office.

Elk Quest 2012

We need elk calf searchers for Saturday and we have some openings (limit is 12!)

We are venturing into the Chequamegon-Nicolet Forest near Clam Lake in Ashland County Sat. 6/9/12 with elk biologists to find elk cows and calves. WDNR biologists will locate elk cows through radio tracking. Once a cow is located, we will form a line and walk through forest habitat in search of her hidden calf, lying motionless to avoid predators. After we find a calf, information will be taken down and then the calf will be fitted with a radio collar. We will conduct several searches throughout the morning and afternoon, driving to different locations throughout the day. Your help is vital to Wisconsin's elk herd. It is likely you will see at least one calf up close!

There is no cost for this field trip but participants must be at least 12 years old. Bring enough to eat and drink throughout the day. Wear long pants and bring a camera, hat, sunglasses, insect repellant, and a long-sleeved shirt.

When: Saturday, June 9

Time: Meet at the Polk County Information Center in St Croix Falls (Hwy 35 and 8.) We will depart at 7am sharp! We need to be in Clam Lake by 9:30 am. It is about a 2.5 hour drive. We will carpool and reimbursement (gas only) is available to drivers. (For alternative transportation arrangements please see contact information below).

Labor Department statement on withdrawal of proposed rule dealing with children who work in agricultural vocations

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Department of Labor today issued the following statement regarding the withdrawal of a proposed rule dealing with children who work in agricultural vocations:

"The Obama administration is firmly committed to promoting family farmers and respecting the rural way of life, especially the role that parents and other family members play in passing those traditions down through the generations. The Obama administration is also deeply committed to listening and responding to what Americans across the country have to say about proposed rules and regulations.

"As a result, the Department of Labor is announcing today the withdrawal of the proposed rule dealing with children under the age of 16 who work in agricultural vocations.

"The decision to withdraw this rule – including provisions to define the 'parental exemption' – was made in response to thousands of comments expressing concerns about the effect of the proposed rules on small family -owned farms. To be clear, this regulation will not be pursued for the duration of the Obama administration.

"Instead, the Departments of Labor and Agriculture will work with rural stakeholders – such as the American Farm Bureau Federation, the National Farmers Union, the Future Farmers of America, and 4-H – to develop an educational program to reduce accidents to young workers and promote safer agricultural working practices."



Meat Animal Quality Assurance Program Information Sheet for Youth and Parents

MAQA

MAQA Trainings

What is MAQA

- The Wisconsin MAQA program is a curriculum consisting of a leader's guide, hands on activities and power point presentations to aid the trainers in program delivery.
- This program meets the requirements of the Youth PQA Plus program from the National Pork Board.
- Care and Management, Animal Health Products and Animal Handling are the topics of the program. One topic is taught per year on a rotational manner.
- The program is for 8-19 year olds as of January 1 of the current year.
- It is designed to be coordinated by local county certified trainers and volunteers.
 Certified trainers need to attend a training once every 3 years and are specifically Extension personnel, Agriculture Education Instructors and Veterinarians.
- County programs need to meet the minimum standards of the WI MAQA program.

 However county programs can be more strict than the WI MAQA program. Contact the counties in which youth exhibit for specific requirements. Currently the Wisconsin June Kewaunee State Fair requires MAQA certification for exhibition in the swine project.

Benefits of Meat Animal Quality Assurance (MAQA) program

- First and foremost this program teaches educational understanding on the basics of animal husbandry and general management practices in raising a project animal. This program provides a foundation of animal management for youth of all ages. The educational value surpasses any exhibition requirements that might exist.
- Research from University of Nebraska indicates youth change their management behaviors after receiving Quality Assurance instruction and achieve higher scores on management quizzes, Skillathon contests and Premier Exhibitor type contests. Youth have a better understanding of animal agriculture.
- Youth are a producer of food, whether they raise 1 or 100 plus animals! A consumer somewhere will be buying and feeding their family with the animals raised by youth.
- Many county programs require educational credits in order to participate and sell in their county programs and meat animal sales. This program often meets that educational requirement or may also be required in some form.
- Many meat processors comment that youth producers have a bad reputation for producing unsafe or questionable products, therefore they hesitate in purchasing animals. This program tells producers/processors that we are educating our youth exhibitors to be responsible food animal producers.
- Youth producers should be expected to follow the same rules and regulations as all other food producers.
- Some processors may require producers to complete Quality Assurance programs in order to market their animals. The MAQA program extends that same requirement and education to youth producers.

How does this program benefit meat processors?

- Assures that exhibitors of the animals that come through processing plants were
 educated on Meat Quality, Proper Injections and Withdrawal times, thus providing a
 safe and wholesome product that will go into the food chain.
- Certification of exhibitors is managed by County Fair Staff, so little to no recordkeeping is required of processors.
- Other major processors require such certification to protect themselves; beneficial for smaller and medium sized processors as well.

How can youth meet the MAQA requirements?

- Attending a meeting annually will meet the requirements. Also if offered in the county, youth may take an exam to meet the requirements of the MAQA program.
- Age brackets are Beginners ages 8-11, Intermediates 12-14 and Advanced ages 15-19.
- Attending a meeting meets the requirement for one year, however taking an exam can meet the requirement for more than one year.
- Once completed, youth are entered into the WI MAQA database by the certified trainer.
- With the MAQA program youth don't receive a certificate much like in other years. A
 decorative certificate can be provided or youth can ask the certified trainer for a print
 out of their certification if desired.

How do youth attend a meeting?

- Contact the local Extension Office or Agriculture Education Instructor for meetings that are in the area.


