

Upham Woods Outdoor Learning Center is happy to announce they are again offering open-enrollment adventure trip opportunities to Wisconsin 1-H members!

#### Devil's Lake Rock Climbing Camp August 5 - 8

Join us for this four-day, three-night exciting introduction to rock climbing. Devil's Lake is the Midwest's premier rock climbing area. Participants will learn how to belay a climber and basic climbing techniques. We will camp at Devil's Lake State Park in a group campsite. During the four days, participants will climb, belay, boulder, repel, and also enjoy swimming, hiking, campfires, nature activities, and group games. Drop off and pick up of participants is at Devil's Lake State Park near Baraboo.

Cost: \$275; cost includes staff instruction, food, and use of all necessary climbing and camping gear.

Ages: 13-18 at the time of the trip

**Experience:** No previous rock climbing experience is required.

Number of Participants: 15



#### Porcupine Mountain Beginning Backpacking Trip August 19-23



Miles of trails await us in Porcupine Mountain State Park, located in the U.P. of Michigan. Thick forests, Lake Superior, and beautiful streams will be our scenery for five-days and four-nights. Participants will learn basic backpacking skills, backcountry cooking, teamwork, and leadership skills. We will hike five to seven miles each day with packs weighing approximately 30-35 pounds. Enjoy nightly campfires and excellent nature viewing opportunities. We travel at a relaxed pace on this trip with plenty of time to hike side trails and explore around our campsites. Drop off and pick up of participants is at Upham Woods, Wisconsin Dells.

**Cost:** \$375; cost includes transportation to and from the Porcupine Mountains (from Upham Woods), backcountry fees, food, and use of a backpack, lightweight sleeping bag, sleeping pad, cooking and eating gear, water filter & bottles, and a backpacking tent.

Ages: 13-18 at the time of the trip

Experience: This trip is good for beginners wishing to try out backpacking and for those who desire a relaxed paced adventure. Number of Participants: 10

## **Camp Counselors Needed for Summer Camp**



Camp counselors are responsible for the youth who attend 4-H camp, in addition to the activities the occur at camp. To be a Camp Counselor you must be 14 by camp, Counselors-In-Training (CIT's) should be age 12 by camp in July.

Responsible youth are needed for the following positions at Summer Camp:

- **Junior Director** is responsible for supervising Resource and Cabin Counselors, serving as liaison between counselors and adult staff, and will also have duties in resource or cabin areas.
- **Resource Counselor's** are responsible for planning, coordinating, and teaching group activities at camp.
- Cabin Counselor's are responsible developing and encouraging fellowship within a cabin group and are responsible for a group of about 10 campers.\
- Counselor's-In-Training (CITs) are accountable to the Camp Director and their cooperating Cabin Counselor. CITs help lead games and activities at camp and support the Cabin Counselors.

Qualified youth should fill out an application found on the Burnett County 4-H Website under member forms. Applications are due to the UWEX office by **April 1, 2012**.

Youth interested in applying must be available for the entire summer camp and also Multi Camp Counselor Training (date TBD).

Selection of 4-H Camp Staff will be done by the 4-H Agent/Camp Director. Questions Contact the UWEX office.

The purpose of Arts Camp:

## **Burnett County 4-H Grant Applications**

Do you need some financial help to complete your 4-H project? There are three 4-H project grants available for youth. They are to help achieve 4-H goals in the project area designated by the grant. Each grant has specific requirements:

#### Nancy Carlson Memorial Grant

History: Nancy Carlson was a very active 4-H member. She was very involved in showing Guern-sey cattle at the Grantsburg Fair.

Grant amounts and requirements: Five (5) \$20 grants will be awarded by the Leaders Association to Burnett County 4-H members who are 9-10 years old. An individual can receive this grant only once in their 4-H career. The grant can be used in any 4-H project area.

#### Claire Erickson Memorial Grant

History: Claire Erickson was very involved with the horse project in Burnett County and taught children how to show horses. He was always involved in the Showdeo at the Grantsburg Fair. Grant amounts and requirements: Two (2) \$25 grants are available from the family of Claire Erickson of Grantsburg. Applicants must be 4-H horse or horseless project members. An individual can receive this grant only once in their 4-H career.

#### **Bessie Peterson Memorial Grant**

History: This grant honors Bessie Peterson, a very special Burnett County individual who believed in the 4-H idea and the many benefits derived from active 4-H involvement.

Grant amounts and requirements: Six (6) \$25 grants will be awarded by the Leaders Association to Burnett County 4-H members who are 11-14 years old. Members must have shown achievement in the past two years of project work. Grants are for the purchase of materials for the achievement of 4-H goals.

#### **Maxine Stone Memorial Grant**

History: Maxine Stone was a long-time 4-H leader who taught many youth in the areas of gardening. In order to continue her legacy this grant has been established to aid members in the horticulture project areas.

Grant Amounts and Requirements: Four (4) \$25 dollar grants will be awarded by the Leaders Association to Burnett County 4-H members in the horticulture/agriculture project areas. Members must have shown achievement in their past project work. Grants are to be used for your horticulture project area materials and projects.

An application form is provided in this issue of the *Bugle*. You can also find the form on the web. The form is the same for all grants; however, if you are applying for more than one grant, please fill out a separate form for each grant.

Application forms are due to in the UWEX office by March 13, 2012.





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### Wisconsin Southdown Stars Sale and Starter Ewe Program

The Wisconsin Southdown Stars Sale and Symposium will be held on April 21<sup>st,</sup> 2012 at the UW Agriculture Research Center Public Events building, Arlington, WI. Details can be found at the Wisconsin Southdown Association's website (www.wisconsinsouthdowns.com). Several



short educational sessions will start the day and will cover an update on genetic testing related to the Southdown breed as well as experienced breeders sharing lessons learned on feeding, fitting and management of Southdowns. Viewing of sale lots will begin at 11:00 with the sale starting promptly at Noon.

The 2012 "Starter Ewe Lambs" will be awarded to several Wisconsin youth at the event. Starter ewe lamb applications are due on March 26<sup>th</sup> and can be found at the website listed above. The Starter Ewe Lamb program is in its 5<sup>th</sup> year and has been an extremely successful way for youth who currently don't have Southdown breeding sheep to get a start in the breed. The youth are provided a high quality ewe lamb and mentorship from the donating breeder until the lamb is of breeding age. Southdowns have become one of the most popular breeds in Wisconsin for youth sheep projects due to the strong network of breeders, the Southdown's moderate size, good temperament and that the breed when shown is "slick sheared" by the youth before showing; eliminating the cost and time of fitting.

Futurity nominated ewe lambs purchased at this sale in 2012 will be eligible for a

\$500 jackpot sponsored by the WI Southdown Association. The jackpot will be awarded to the highest placing ewe in the American Southdown Breeders Association (ASBA) Pot O Gold Futurities. This jackpot is in addition to any monies awarded by the ASBA. In 2011, the winner of the largest of the ASBA Futurities, the ewe lamb futurity, was purchased at this sale!

## Tree Seedlings Available for 4H Clubs!

The Wisconsin DNR - State Nursery Program would like to encourage 4H clubs and other youth groups to plant trees. Trees provide a home for wildlife, protect our soil and water, and help clean our air. The State Nursery Program has a long tradition of providing tree seedlings to 4-H, FFA and other youth groups. These seedlings may be used for reforestation, soil erosion prevention and wildlife habitat improvement. This is a great way for youth to get outdoors and learn about nature, especially those members involved in the Forestry project or other nature projects.

#### Here's how your club can order:



- 1. Go online to: <a href="http://dnr.wi.gov/forestry/Nursery/Order/index.htm">http://dnr.wi.gov/forestry/Nursery/Order/index.htm</a> and download an order form for a list of available trees and prices. Or you may contact one of the three state nurseries for a tree order form. Phone (608) 375-4123 or (715) 424-3700
- 2. Determine the quantity and species of trees each family would like to order. Tree seedlings come in bundles of 25 and therefore must be ordered in increments of 25.
- 3. Consolidate everyone's order and have the club place the order.
- 4. You can either choose to pick your trees up at one of the 3 nurseries or have them shipped to your county. You will receive a notice from the State Nursery Program in April about receiving your seedlings.

Normally state nursery policy requires a minimum order of 1000 trees, 500 shrubs or one packet. However the minimum order requirement is waived for 4H and other youth groups, allowing them to consolidate orders to give students the opportunity to plant smaller tree volumes on their family's property.

While the nurseries try to be accommodating to youth groups, the statutes and administrative codes concerning seedling distribution still need to be followed. The above exemptions apply only to current, active members, not alumni or outside individuals. Seedlings cannot be re-sold or given away. They may not be planted for landscaping or for Christmas trees.
