


Youth Tractor Safety Training

The hours of the course are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.Students must be at least 12 years old to enroll in the program and attendance at all three days' training is required for certification. Cost of the course is \$20.



With only 122 members in 4 clubs is it viable for a full time person? - We need a full time agent, it is more than just the 122 members in the 4 clubs- it is the families and community that goes with it. We need to give the full time person a stable feeling that the job isn't always in jeopardy. The agent has been asked to take on continuously more expectations with less help (meaning secretarial). The final answer we gave after much discussion was that yes, we felt an extreme need of the full time person needs to be hired as youth extension agent. Without the fulltime agent; 4-H and many other youth organizations that have just begun to form strong foundations are going to be affected severely. We need a full time agent and a full time secretary!

Meeting reconvened – New Business

Horse Clinic - Discussion & questions about information posted in Bugle concerning the "Central Burnett County Fair Horse" kick –off mtg. Charlene Strabel stated this is not part of the fair and we need to know what this is all about including agenda.

Extension Report by Marilyn Kooiker,
