




END THE YEAR WITH A NEW 4-H PLATE

Madison, Wis. (December 2019) – As the end of the year approaches, it's the perfect time to show your 4-H pride by ordering a Wisconsin 4-H license plate for the car, truck or motor home. The specialty plate, now available through the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles, supports the Wisconsin 4-H program, and bears the message 4-H Empowering Youth. The sale of the plate includes a fee that goes to the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation.

"This is a great way for our 4-H families, alumni and supporters to show their fierce love of 4-H," says Brenda Scheider, Executive Director for the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation. "Half of the proceeds from every plate sale will go back to the county in which the plate was purchased. The other half will be used for state and regional 4-H programs."

Vehicles that qualify for the 4-H license plate include:

- automobiles
- motor homes (annual registration only)
- motor trucks
- o 4,500, 6,000 or 8,000 pounds gross weight including dual purpose farm and dual purpose motor home

12,000 pounds gross weight farm truck

Persons requesting 4-H Foundation license plates will pay:

- \$25 annual donation. The donation may be deductible.
- \$15 issuance fee or an annual \$15 personalized plate fee, if requested.

The regular registration fee for the vehicle if the current plates expire within three months or the vehicles has no plates.

At each plate renewal, 4-H supporters will pay the \$25 donation and the regular registration fee for non-personalized 4-H license plates.


4-H license plates may be personalized by paying a \$15 personalized plate fee each year in addition to the \$25 donation and regular annual registration fee.

Wisconsin 4-H Town Halls

WI State 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl and 4-H Skillathon contests scheduled for March 7, 2020

(Madison) The 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl and State 4-H Skillathon contests will be held together on Saturday March 7, 2020 at UW Madison Animal Sciences Building, Madison, WI. <u>Deadline for registration is Feb. 21, 2020, 5 p.m. Only emailed registrations will be accepted, mailed registrations will NOT be accepted.</u> The cost is \$12 per youth and due at the time of registration. Registration starts at 9 a.m., competitions start at 9:30 a.m. Teams are encouraged to participate in both contests as they will be occurring at the same time. The planning committee reserves the right to alter schedule if needed to manage both contests effectively.

The teams are divided into three age divisions and teams can consist of 3 or 4 members. The junior division are youth who are under 14 years of age as of Jan.1, 2020. The senior division are youth who are all 14 years of age or older as of Jan. 1, 2020. A mixed team must contain at least one youth from each age division.

Livestock Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics and students use a buzzer in order to answer the questions. Teams compete in a double elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Each match has both an individual and toss-up question round. The winning 4-H senior team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Livestock Quiz Bowl competition in Louisville, KY at the North American International Livestock Exposition.

Skillathon contest is made up of a written quiz and learning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification as well as some team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. The top Senior level 4-H team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Skillathon Contest, held each fall in Louisville at the North American International Livestock Exposition.

Competition in Quiz Bowl & Skillathon encourages members to develop a more complete knowledge of animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational program for all project members, including those who may not own a project animal, and provides a way to develop self-confidence. These programs are a great parallel to some similar programs that breed associations and other organizations conduct such as Junior Cattle Nationals, NJSA (National Junior Swine Association) and the All-American Sheep Show.

RULES AND GUIDELINES

- Each 4-H member may perform in two events in divisions A-E either as an individual or group in addition to dub
 performance. Example: group vocal (Division D) and group instrumental (Division A) and your club's performance
 OR Individual piano and group vocal and your dub's performance. An entrant cannot perform a group vocal with
 two 4-Hers and a group vocal with two different 4-Hers as he/she would be competing against himself/herself.
- All clubs are encouraged to bring a large ensemble, as it builds club cohesiveness.
- Individual and group performances are limited to three minutes, except for grades 9-13, who are limited to five
 minutes. Advanced piano performers are allotted five minutes. Points will be deducted if contestant goes over the
 time limit.
- Each individual/ group entry should consist of one musical selection.
- Each instrumental and piano performer must provide the judge a copy of the music they are performing.
- Voice over tapes or CDs are allowed but strongly discouraged. Please try to use an accompanist or background
 music tape or CD. If the singer must use a voice over recording, the singer will need to use a microphone to have
 his/her voice heard over that of the recorded performer.
- In all divisions, appearance and stage presence will count as part of your score. Remember to dress so that you
 look your best!
- See back for judging criteria.
- Monetary awards will be given to 1st 4th place.
