Sign me up! How do I register?

You are able to register for events/contests through 4-H online! All you need to do is log-in to your 4-H online account, click events (over on the left) and click the "register +" button to see the events available to you. This one is listed under Burnett County Cultural Arts Fest or just Cultural Arts Fest. If you have any questions or concerns, please connect with Beth Rank, beth.rank@wisc.edu or 715-349-2151. Because we are trying this system out for the first time, in addition to registering in 4HOnline, please submit your paper forms to the Extension Burnett County Office by either mailing forms (must be received by April 1st) or by dropping them off in the brown mailbox outside the Government Center. On April 10th:

To drop off or pick up static entries (Arts & Crafts, Photography, Written Poetry, and Written Short Stories), please select one family member to drop off everything for the household on a table outside the Adventures Church in Siren. Face covering are required during drop off and pick up of entries. Please avoid congregating outside the venue and maintain at least 6' distance between each family during these times. No contestants will be allowed in the Siren Adventures Church due to capacity restrictions.

In order to participate in the in-person contests, the following rules must be followed:

- Face coverings are required while indoors and/or outdoors within 6' of someone outside your household.
- Contestants will be sorted into pods of up to eight youth with a judge and a certified adult volunteer. Siblings and known bubbles will most likely be in the same pod. Members from the same 4-H club and/or school may also be in the same pod. The number of youth in each pod will be determined by the maximum amount of time a performance can take, per division.
- Contestants will remain in their pod to perform all their contest entries. Before or after performing, youth must be respectful of other contestants in their pod. Failure to do this may result in a disqualification, at the judge's discretion.
- By Friday, April 9th, contestants will be emailed with information about what pod they are in. A
 roster with pod information will be hung on the outside door of the church so contestants can
 reference the chart to make sure they join the correct pod. Upon arrival, a contestant will be
 instructed to join their pod in a room or an area of the fellowship hall. They will be instructed to
 go directly to the room and maintain 20' from other pods and try to maintain 6' between
 contestants outside their household, when practical.
- Once all contestants have performed and received written feedback from the judge, the entire
 pod, including the judge, may exit the building together, reunite with their family and leave. The
 clerk will be asked to sanitize the room then turn in the clerking sheet and are also free to
 leave the building.

- There is an opportunity for youth to perform virtually, if desired. Depending on the number of
 virtual entries, a separate judge may be identified to judge them remotely or the virtual
 contestant may participate as an additional contestant in a pod. Youth will be asked to log into
 a Zoom meeting with the judge and perform in real time as if they were in person. They will be
 judged on the same criteria as in-person contestants.
- The total amount of time 4-H groups can occupy an indoor space is two hours, this includes set up and take down of all signage, getting contestants, clerks, and judges in their pods and performing.
- The maximum number of youth who can participate in-person at this event is 35. Other contestants above this maximum will be asked to perform virtually instead of in-person.
- No late registrations will be accepted.
- Please stay home if: you, or anyone in your household are experiencing any of the symptoms
 of COVID-19 or have had known contact with anyone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- UW-Madison Division of Extension faculty, staff and volunteers may require that program participants leave a program, based on health concerns associated with COVID-19.

Communication Contest Information

Category 1 MEMORIZED 4-H PLEDGE

Open to first year members and Cloverbuds. Youth can only enter this category once in 4-H career.

Category 2 PREPARED SPEECH

May be on any subject. You are allowed to use a speech you prepared for another contest. Props and visuals may not be used. Judges may ask up to 3 questions.

Time limits: Grades K-2 – 2-3 minutes

Grades 3-8 – 3-5 minutes

Grades 9 and up - 5-8 minutes

Category 3 **EXTEMPORANEOUS**

Each participant will draw three topics and choose one for their speech. Participants will have 30 minutes to prepare their speeches. 3X5 cards will be provided. Other writing materials should be provided by the member.

Category 4 PROSE ORIGINAL

May be read or memorized. Cloverbud & Junior entries: 5 minute maximum time allowed. Intermediate & Senior entries 10 minute maximum time allowed.

Category 5 PROSE NON-ORIGINAL

May be read or memorized. Cloverbud & Junior entries: 5 minute maximum time allowed. Intermediate & Senior entries 10 minute maximum time allowed.

Category 6 POETRY ORIGINAL

May be read or memorized. Cloverbud & Junior entries: 5 minute maximum time allowed. Intermediate & Senior entries 10 minute maximum time allowed. One poem, not a collection.

Category 7 POETRY NON-ORIGINAL

May be read or memorized. Cloverbud & Junior entries: 5 minute maximum time allowed. Intermediate & Senior entries 10 minute maximum time allowed. One poem, not a collection.

Category 8 (WRITTEN) CREATIVE SHORT STORY

The story may be on any subject, and may be fiction or non-fiction. Stories must be original. Entries may be typed or legibly hand written. (Typing may be done by someone else.) Each entry must have a cover page giving the following:

- 1. Title of story
- 2. Fiction or non-fiction
- 3. Author's name and age

Entries should have a plastic or paper binder cover.

Category 9 (WRITTEN) CREATIVE POETRY

The poem may be on any subject, and may be fiction or non-fiction. Poem must be original. Entries may be typed or legibly hand written. (Typing may be done by someone else.) Each entry must have a cover page giving the following:

- 1. Title of story
- 2. Fiction or non-fiction
- 3. Author's name and age

Entries should have a plastic or paper binder cover.

Category 10 CLOVERBUD PROJECT ORAL PRESENTATION

ANYTHING CREATED OCTOBER 1, 2020 TO DATE OF CONTEST.

Open only to youth in grades K-2. Bring your item and share with the judge and audience your creation, something unique about it, and why you made it the way you did.

Drama Contest Information

4-H Mini Drama

- 4 or more people.
- Must be memorized.
- 15-minute maximum time limit.
- Minimal props and costumes.
- Can be performed in any room.

4-H Choral Reading

- Group reading a story, poem, prose, etc.
- Can be done in unison or each member reading parts or both.
- 2 or more people. No props or costumes. 10-minute max.
- Does not need to be memorized.

4-H Storytelling

- Memorization is encouraged.
- Minimal props/costumes.
- 10-minute time limit.

Act in a Sack (Extemporaneous Acting)

A team of two to four youth receive a sack of props for an act and have ten minutes to organize a 5 minute act or play.

The Act should have:

- 1. A situation and characters whose meanings are clear to the audience.
- 2. There must be a problem or conflict for the characters to solve (this is what makes a drama)
- 3. The characters must actively show, not tell, the events of the story.

Examples of situations:

- 1. Recently crimes have been taking place. Since you are detectives, how can you solve the mystery?
- 2. Orders have arrived from the President to a group of scientists to go explore a new island or creature, or planet. How can you prepare for the trip?
- 3. A group of travelers are all aboard an airplane bound for a foreign country. After some engine malfunctions they are forced to land. They discover they are in a country no one has ever known before. The inhabitants and their customs are very different from those in the U.S.
- 4. A school is closing and all students are to be bussed to another school on the other side of town. The students there seem to be quite different from those at the other school.
- 5. Create your own situation.
