Is there a deadline to submit?

Nope. Programs are needed ongoing! Submission dates are weekly. After you submit, sessions will be reviewed by a committee of youth leaders, volunteers and staff using our Positive Youth Development learning review process adapted for virtual learning.

Our committee will respond to submissions with a follow up e-mail or call to the primary contact

within a week.

2nd Annual Wisconsin 4-H Service Learning Project

Plarn Mats Project

What is plarn? It's "plastic yarn." Youth cut plastic shopping bags into loops. They knot those loops together to make plastic yarn. One youth or volunteer crochets the plarn into a mat. Reusing

plastic bags helps the environment. Donated mats support individuals who are experiencing unsheltered



homelessness.

Who can be part of the project? Everyone. From Kindergarten to adulthood, anyone can help. There are five project steps. Youth can help collect and sort bags, cut plastic loops, knot plarn together. They can even crochet the plarn into a mat. Youth leaders play an important role in identifying where to donate plarn or mats, leading discussions, and organizing the project.

What will the youth learn? Youth learn about homelessness through the project, going beyond stereotypes we see on television. The Explore More section encourages youth to do research and get involved. Then, they can share what they learn with others. Information and resources are included to support youth participants who know someone or are experiencing homelessness themselves.



July 15, 2021 — Forts Folle Avoine, Danbury

Burnett County 4-H Day Camp is for all youth in grades K-2 and 3-5. This year's theme is **Stepping Back in Time**. Youth don't have to be an enrolled 4-H member to participate in this fun event! The North West and XY trading posts, and the Ojibwe Village constructed at Forts Folle Avoine are accurate depictions reflecting the close relationship that existed between the European fur traders and their Ojibwe trading partners who operated in Burnett County between 1802 and 1805. Campers will go on a guided tour of Forts Folle Avoine, make bread in a bag and bake it in a clay oven, make homemade butter and ice cream, and play games and work on crafts like youth did back in the early 1800s.

Priority is given to currently enrolled 4-H youth who register prior to June 14th. Final registration deadline is July 1, 2021 for all youth. There are twenty slots available for K-2 and twenty slots available for 3-5th graders. Camp will be filled based on the date registration is received.
